#### Agency Update Two-Month Executive Summary

Project	Recent Work
Outreach and advocacy	<ul> <li><u>FAFSA Completion Initiative</u>: Thus far, nearly 60 percent of Washington school districts are now eligible to access FAFSA data on the portal, and the majority of respondents say they have used data from the FAFSA Completion Portal in conversations with students.</li> <li><u>College Bound Scholarship</u>: The preliminary CBS sign-up rate for the Class of 2019 is now at 90 percent statewide, surpassing our 89 percent mark from last year.</li> <li><u>The 12th Year Campaign</u>: We already have over 70 sites signed up for either the College Application Campaign, College Goal Washington, or both, and we expect an influx of sign-ups when school starts again in the fall.</li> <li><u>GEAR UP Summer Camps</u>: WSAC staff hosted two GEAR UP summer camps, providing postsecondary information to prospective high school students.</li> <li><u>GEAR UP Conference</u>: WSAC GEAR UP staff joined representatives from WA GEAR UP schools, as well as staff from GEAR UP programs nationwide at the 2015 National Council for Community and Education Partnerships (NCCEP)/GEAR UP annual conference in San Francisco July 18-22.</li> </ul>
Policy and research	<ul> <li>Veterans' Residency Bill: The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs has confirmed that Washington is now compliant with Section 702, signaling that veterans in Washington will be able to use their VA benefits to attend college.</li> <li>WaACRAO Presentations: Staff from WSAC presented on several topics at the annual Washington Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admission Officers (WaACRAO).</li> <li>Prior Learning Assessment Webinar: WSAC staff participated as a panel member in a national webinar focused on building credit for prior learning into institutional culture.</li> <li>Prior Learning Assessment Workgroup: The PLA Workgroup, convened by WSAC, met on August 5th to discuss implementation of policies for veterans to meet requirements of SB 5969 (veterans' residency legislation), passed last year.</li> <li>Improving Student Learning at Scale (ISLS): NGA has extended Washington's grant through December 2015 and awarded Washington with an additional \$25,000. The ISLS team plans to allocate a portion of that money to the development of communications materials related to the Smarter Balanced implementation.</li> <li>Washington Assistive Technology Transferability (WATT) Workgroup: The Disability Task Force recommended the formation of the WATT workgroup in their 2014 report to the Legislature. The WATT workgroup held their first meeting in July, and will work to identify and address barriers associated with the transferability of assistive technology from K-12 to postsecondary education and training for students with disabilities.</li> </ul>
Programs	<ul> <li><u>SFA Trainings</u>: WSAC financial aid staff continue to provide training and guidance related to program administration.</li> <li><u>GET</u>: In the July 13th meeting the GET Committee began formal discussions about next steps for GET in response to the College Affordability Act.</li> </ul>

# TWO-MONTH REVIEW

The Executive Director update will highlight the agency's efforts related to our statutory mission and program administration.

The two-month summary chart provides a synopsis of agency efforts since the last Council meeting.



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Outreach and advocacy	<ul> <li><u>College BoundScholarship</u>: Staff attended three CBS events in April in May, induding a UWT event that drew over800 students.</li> <li><u>GEAR UP</u>: This spring, the WSAC GEAR UP team created two new awards. The first recognizes high- achieving students from GEAR UP schools. These cond award celebrates exemplary GEAR UP coordinators who work insupport of all GEAR UP students.</li> <li><u>FAFSA Completion Initiative</u>: As of May 29, 140 school districts have signed on to participate in the FAFSA Completion Initiative. Which provides student-level FAFSA completion data to district personnel.</li> </ul>
Policy and research	<u>Regional Gold Gavel Award</u> : WSAC received the ESD 105 Golden Gavel Award, in honor of the agency's commitment to strengthening secondary to postsecondary transitions. <u>Veterans</u> : WSACstaff continue d its support of veterans' transitions through multiple events with Governor Inslee's Veterans Employee Resource Group. <u>ISLS</u> : The ISLS work will continue past its original deadline of June 30th, due in large part to an opportunity from the NGA to extend the duration of the grant and receive additional funding. T <u>Dual Credit</u> : WSAC staff presented at the May 7National Alliance of Concurrent Enrolment, providing insights to our state's efforts to strengthen college transitions and expand dual credit opportunities for Washingtonstudents.
Programs	<ul> <li><u>SFA Trainings</u>: Financial aid staff presented state aid workshops at six locations across the state with nearly 200 aid administrators in attendance from the 68 participating institutions.</li> <li><u>Health Loan Repayment Program</u>: The federal Health Professional Loan Repayment program received 85 applications for the 2015 cycle, and approximately 13 professional Loan Repayment program received 85 applications for the 2015 cycle, and approximately 13 professional will be selected to receive funding to repay student loars due to their commitment to serving as a health care professional in a critical short age area.</li> <li><u>Financial Aid - Institution Application</u>: WSAC staff are reviewing an application from an institution (Victoria's Academy of Cosmetology) to participate in state financial aid.</li> <li><u>GEF</u>: Unit purchases at this year's price canstill be made through June 25, and are currently tracking about 6 percent above the same time last year, with over 490,000 units sold as of June 1</li> </ul>
