Strategic Action Plan and Legislative Priorities

- Enhance the State Need Grant program and fully fund it by 2023.
- Invest in public higher education (maintain tuition reduction and funding for them).
- Agency request:
 - > \$19 million to support 4,500 additional students of 27,000 unserved.
 - Keep College Bound strong: \$531,000 to support 2015 Legislation and the 14 fold increase in students.
 - ➤ Support the STEM Education Innovation Alliance (\$155,000).
 - Enhance consumer protection related to regulatory oversight for out-of-state institutions degree. approval, eligibility of institutions for the SNG; and approval of veterans benefits programs (\$223,000).




