## **Education Attainment: Our Goal**

Increase the number of adults in Spokane County who have high quality certificates or post-secondary degrees to 60% by 2025

ADOPTED by GSI Board of Trustees on September 23, 2013

## **Greater Minds Education Attainment target:**

86,000 working adults with some college, no degree

## WA State Education Attainment goal:

At least 70 percent of adults will have a postsecondary credential

  - Whitworth University

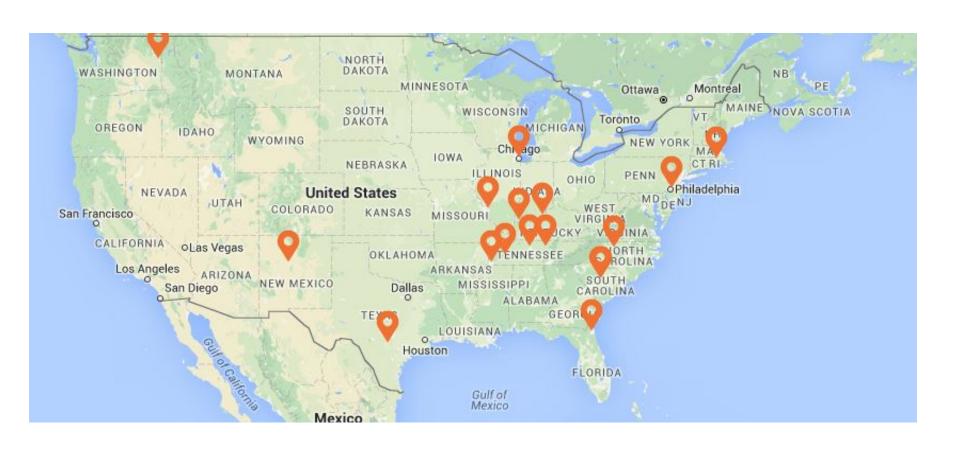


## Greater Minds: How we got here

- Engaged Lumina Foundation Community Partnership for Attainment
- Convened of our partners for strategic planning sessions resulting in the development of an initiative to address working adults, businesses and higher education.
- Selection of Graduate! Network model
  - 22 communities
  - Sharing of tools and best practices

# Employer Pilot Survey

- 7 companies participated with over 2,000 responses
- 741 adults had some college but no degree
- Over half (56%) of those surveyed wanted to achieve a higher level of post-secondary education.
- Survey also identified a low number of loan default



# What Employees Told Us

- Financial assistance
  - Financial aid and prior learning credit
  - Tuition reimbursement from employer
- Flexibility in time and schedule
  - Work schedule
  - Class times
- Individualized planning
  - Help in identifying a college program
  - Customized plan for completion
  - Work/life balance



# Survey Results of Higher Ed Institutions

## From the informal survey we know

- Programs/classes of study are offered during night and weekend hours
- On-line options vary per institution
- Orientation for adult students
- Advisement offered for adult students
- Credit for prior learning
- Services like childcare not offered outside daytime work hours



# Greater Minds: Strategy

Neutral navigation point of contact for working adults was key

- Concierge set of services
  - Business support
  - Higher-Ed support
  - Adult student support to and through



## How we do it

## **Three Phases of Neutral Navigation**

#### Phase I: Preparation

- Assist employees to understand and own their education, personal and career goals and to create an appropriate and realistic plan for degree or credential completion.
- Identify issues that may inhibit employee's success in college, identify solutions, and assist with developing an individual education plan.

#### Phase II: Pre-enrollment Navigation

- Identify higher education opportunities and resources that best meet employees goals.
- Refer to higher educational institution to obtain detailed program information and advisement.



## How we do it

#### Phase III: Ongoing Support

- In-person workshops facilitated by Greater Minds staff with the help of higher education and community organization stakeholders.
  - Topics could include:
    - College Connect return to learning college fairs
    - Online Learning
    - Financial Aid/FASFA
    - Prior Learning Assessments Competency Credits
    - Study Skills
- Ongoing access to the Greater Minds Navigator will be available as a secondary resource to the working adult.
