


Figure 1. High School Senior FAFSA Completion Rates, Academic Year 2021-22

Figure 2. Recipients of the College Bound Scholarship Compared to Recipients of the Washington College Grant by Race/Ethnicity, Academic Year 2020-21






Figures 3-4. Highest Postsecondary Credential Earned within 8 Years of High School Graduation, Trend




Figures 5-6. Highest Postsecondary Credential Earned within 8 Years of High School Graduation, by Race/Ethnicity, 2012 Graduates





Figure 9. Educational Attainment, Ages 25+, Percentages by Race/Ethnicity, 2021




Figure 11. Awards Conferred by Select Postsecondary Institutions in, or Associated with*, the Tri-Cities Region Compared to Awards Conferred by Related Sectors, 2020-21




Figure 12. Graduation Rate (within 150% of Normal Time) at Select Postsecondary Institutions in, or Associated with*, the Tri-Cities Region Compared to Graduation Rate at Related Sectors, Trend

K-12 Enrollment & Other Information

There are 11 school districts in the Tri-Cities region: ESD 123 (acting as a school district), Finley, Kahlotus, Kennewick, Kiona-Benton City, North Franklin, Pasco, Paterson, Prosser, Richland, and Star. In most cases, data for all districts in the region have been combined. In some cases, data are reported separately for the three largest school districts in the region: Kennewick, Pasco, and Richland.




Figure 13. K-12 Public School Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Academic Year 2021-22, Selected Districts















Figure 18. Percent of High School Graduates Enrolled in College within One Year of Graduation, by Race/Ethnicity, 2019 Graduates


Figure 19. Percent of High School Graduates Enrolled in College within One Year of Graduation, by Income Category, 2019 Graduates, Selected Districts




Figure 20. Where High School Graduates Enrolled in College Their First Year, 2019 Graduates, Selected Districts




Figure 22. Undergraduate Enrollment in Postsecondary Institutions Located in, or Associated with*, the Tri-Cities Region by Race/Ethnicity Compared to Enrollment in Related Sectors, Fall 2020






Figure 24. Total Population by Select Age Categories, 2021




Figure 25. Unemployment Rate Trends, Washington State Compared to Tri-Cities Region


